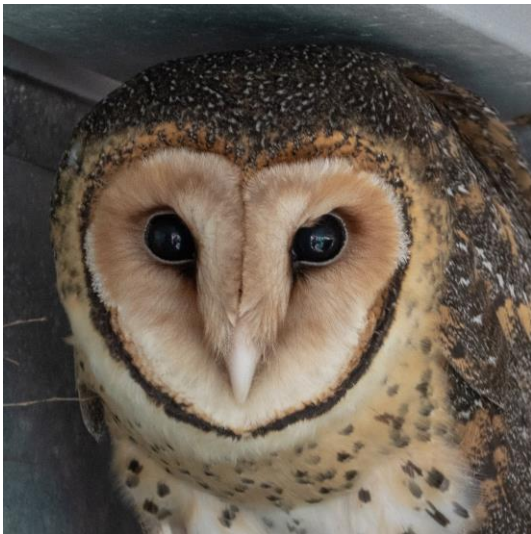


Take care who you kill!



Some of the most common rat baits (rodenticides) are attractive and lethal not only to their intended target but to our pets and to wildlife such as Quenda and Possums. Chuditch and birds of prey, especially Owls, are weakened and killed through 'secondary poisoning' from their baited prey. Our precious wildlife is at risk. Some baits are less harmful than others. You can help.

- Try using traps rather than baits to control rats and mice.
 - If using baits, read the label carefully and store out of reach of pets and children.
- ✓ USE only baits containing the active ingredients Coumatetralyl or Warfarin and carefully follow package instructions.



X DO NOT USE those with Brodifacoum (the chief ingredient in most Ratsak brands), Bromodialone (in some Ratsak products) and Difenacoum (e.g. Talon, Mortein, Ratsak Fast Action, Pestoff Rodent Bait 20R, Klerat).
