Some of the most common rat baits (rodenticides) are attractive and lethal not only to their intended target but to our pets and to wildlife such as Quenda and Possums. Birds of prey and nocturnal wildlife, especially Owls, are weakened and killed through 'secondary poisoning' from their baited prey. **YOU CAN HELP**

- Try using traps rather than baits to control rats and mice.
- If using baits, read the label carefully and store out of reach of pets.
- ✓ Use only the less harmful baits - those containing the active ingredients COUMATETRALYL or WARFARIN.
